

# CHANGES TO THE MARKETPLACE IN 2022

**From 1 January 2022 Exporters from the EU (Excluding Ireland) to GB will require**

1. Import declaration
2. IPAFFS PRE-NOTIFICATION for SPS goods
3. Goods Movement Reference Number - GMR

**From 1 January 2022 Exporters from Ireland to GB will continue as now**

1. Import declaration continue on the delayed basis up to 175 days
2. No IPAFFS Prenotifications required for SPS goods
3. GMR Not required as we continue to operate under the current system

**From 1 January 2022 Exporters from Ireland to EU using GB Landbridge - Transits**

Live animals, Germinal Products and High Risk animal by product Transiting GB must give 24 hour IPAFFS Prenotification before entering GB and notify ImportsRiskManagement@apha.gov.uk of their departure from GB. All other POAO and Animal By-Products (ABP's) must give 4 hours IPAFFS prenotification and notify GBtransit-notification@defra.gov.uk of departure.

**NEW Export Health Certs on Imports into EU on 15 Jan 2022**

New Animal Health Regulation (AHR) Export Health Certificates (EHCs) will need to be used for all products of Animal Origin, Live Animals, germinal products & Composite Products exported to the EU from 15th January 2022. Current EHCs signed before 15th Jan 2022 can be used until 15th Mar 2022 for goods on route to the EU.

**NEW Timetable for movement of Agri Food IMPORTS into GB**

- Requirement for Export Health Certs
- Border Control Posts Physical Checks
- Safety & Security Declarations

—————> **1 July 2022**

**Food BUSINESS Operator (FBO) Identity & Address**

Pre-packaged food sold on the EU market from 1 October 2022 must have an EU manufacturer's identity and address or the name and address of the importer into the EU. The 21- month grace period introduced to allow the depletion of stock runs out on that date.

**UKCA (UK Conformity Assessed) marking Delayed until 1 January 2023**



This was due to be implemented on 1 Jan 2022 for most goods being placed on the UK market, that previously required the CE marking. Businesses can continue to use the CE marking until 1 Jan 2023
